

Trade integration in Africa is aimed mainly at intra-African trade in goods and services by removing financial and non-financial barriers, improving cooperation, and developing continental value chains.

This 28th African reinsurance Forum will debate the need for harmonisation and why, although regional projects are already progressing well, the (re)insurance sector needs to back the concept of a continentwide harmonisation for the industry. The insurance industry could benefit hugely from cross-border co-operation, allowing smaller markets to build and larger markets to diversify. The African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA) creates a market of 1.4 billion people and a combined GDP of US\$3.4 trillion, with financial services accounting for some \$150 billion back in 2020.
